Faculty of Philosophy, University of Niš has issued a call for enrolment in the first year of **Master Academic Studies** (one-year programme) for 335 students: 100 financed and 255 self-financing, for the 2021/2022 academic school year.

*During the entrance examination in June, one financed student has enrolled in the Master Academic Studies of French Language and Literature programme (within the double degree programme). In October, 4 students can enrol in this study programme financed from the budget. Foreign students cannot be financed from the budget of the Republic of Serbia.

Tuition fee for self-financing students is **79.000,00 Serbian dinars both for domestic and foreign students (approx. 675€ or 780\$)**.

A Master Studies student can pay the complete tuition fee during enrolment in the first year of studies, or in **ten instalments**.

Candidates who have completed the Bachelor Studies at the Faculty of Philosophy in Niš as financed students by the affirmative standards either as persons with disabilities or members of the Roma community, and who have been ranked within the estimated number, can enrol in the study programme as financed students by the affirmative standards.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Applicants who have completed the appropriate Bachelor Studies lasting 4 years can enrol in the Master Academic Studies, that is, applicants who have acquired at least 240 ECTS credits, as well as the applicants who have completed their Bachelor Studies lasting 4 years under the regulations that were in effect prior to the commencement of the Law on Higher Education.

The ranking of the applicants for the enrolment in the first year of Master Academic Studies is based on the average Bachelor Studies' grade, as well as the compatibility of the Bachelor

Studies programme the applicants have completed and the Master Academic Studies they have applied for. Advantage is given to the applicants who have studied for a shorter period of time in case of identical number of points.

Foreign citizens can enrol in the study programme under the same conditions as a domestic citizen, when they provide a validated diploma of completed previous level of studies, as well as a certificate of the Serbian language proficiency and a certificate of medical insurance.

Entrance exams are organized at the following study programmes:

1. Master Academic Studies of Philosophy

Candidates who have not completed Bachelor Academic Studies of Philosophy take an exam from the following subjects: History of Philosophy I – IV, Introduction to Logic, and Logic.

2. Master Academic Studies of History

Candidates who have not completed Bachelor Academic Studies of History take an exam from the following subjects: History of Ancient, Middle, and New Ages, General and National history.

3. Master Academic Studies of Psychology

Candidates who have not completed Bachelor Academic Studies of Psychology take an exam from the following subjects: **Psychopathology, Social Psychology, Basis of developmental psychology, Psychology of Work, Psychology of Management, Methodology of psychological research and Psychometry.**

4. Master Academic Studies of Pedagogy

Candidates who have not completed Bachelor Academic Studies of Pedagogy take an exam from the following subjects: Preschool pedagogy, School pedagogy, Didactics, Methodology of pedagogy, History of pedagogy, Family pedagogy, Social pedagogy.

5. Master Academic Studies of Sociology

Candidates who have not completed Bachelor Academic Studies of Sociology take an exam from the following subjects: General sociology, Sociological theories, and Methodology of sociological research.

6. Master Academic Studies of Social Work

Candidates who have not completed Bachelor Academic Studies of Social Policy and Social Work take an exam from the following subjects: Social work theories, Individual social work, Group social work, Community social work, Professional ethics of social work, Geriatric social work, Basics of counselling, Representation in social work.

Candidates who have at least two years of work experience in the field of social work take an exam from the following subjects: Social work theories, Individual social work, Group social work, and Community social work.

7. Master Academic Studies of Communicology

Compatibility between the Bachelor Studies programme the applicant has completed and the Master Academic Studies of Communicology is awarded 5 points.

8. Master Academic Studies of Philology

Applicants who have not completed Bachelor Academic Studies of Serbian Studies take an exam from the following subjects:

- a) In the Serbian and Comparative Literature module: Literary theory, History of Serbian literature, General and comparative literature;
- b) In the Methodology of teaching the Serbian language and literature module: Literature teaching methodology, Literary theory, Introduction to methodology of teaching, Methodology of teaching the Serbian language and Introduction to general linguistics;
- c) In the Serbian module: Introduction to general linguistics, Old Church Slavonic language, Introduction to dialectology, Phonetics with phonology, Morphology, Syntax, History of language, and History of literary language;
- d) In the Literature and Film module: Literary theory, History of Serbian literature, General and comparative literature.

9. Master Academic Studies of English Language and Literature Applicants who have not completed Bachelor Academic Studies of English Language and Literature take an exam in C1 English level in the Common European Framework of Reference. Compatibility between the Bachelor Studies programme that the applicant has completed and the Master Academic Studies of English Language and Literature is awarded 10 points.

10. Master Academic Studies of Russian Language and Literature

Applicants who have not completed Bachelor Academic Studies of Russian Language and Literature take an exam from the following subjects: Phonology of the Russian language, Morphology of the Russian language, Lexicology of the Russian language, Syntax of the Russian language, Russian literature in the 18th century, Russian literature in the 19th century, Russian literature in the 20th century, Contemporary Russian literature.

11. Master Academic Studies of French Language and Literature Applicants who have not completed Bachelor Academic Studies of French Language and Literature at a University in Serbia or abroad take an exam from the following subjects:

- a)** French language (Phonetics with phonology, Morphosyntax, Simple and complex sentence syntax, Phraseology, Traductology);
- b)** French literature (general overview of the epochs and directions from Old-French to contemporary literature, great authors and their works, prominent poetic manifestos);
- b)** Didactics of French language (understanding the written text).

Applicants who have not completed the appropriate Bachelor Study programmes have a right to be ranked for enrolment at a study programme which they have applied for if they pass the differential exam.

DOCUMENTATION SUBMITTED DURING THE APPLICATION

When applying, candidates are obliged to present the following documents for inspection:

- Application form (which can be filled in online via an app on the site of the Faculty; in case they apply at the Office of Students' Affairs at the Faculty, the form can be downloaded from the site of the Faculty),
- Uncertified diploma photocopy or a certificate of previously completed level of education,
- Uncertified diploma supplement photocopy or a certificate of passed exams,
- Biometric ID card data printout,
- Proof of payment of the application fee to the Faculty bank account **840-1818666-89**, reference number **742121028**, the amount of **5.000,00** dinars.

DEADLINES

Candidates interested in enrolment submit the application to the Faculty and the required documents from **October 4, 2021** until **October 22, 2021**.

An app for electronic application of candidates will be in service from **October 4, 2021** at 8.00 AM until **October 20, 2021** at 12.00 PM. Candidates can submit applications in person at the Office of Students' Affairs at the Faculty from **October 11, 2021** until **October 22, 2021** from 11.00 AM until 2.00 PM, office 104.

Entrance examination will be held on **October 23, 2021** according to the schedule which will be posted on the bulletin boards and the site of the Faculty.

Faculty will post the ranking list of applicants on **October 25, 2021**.

Candidates have a right to submit a complaint to the Dean of the Faculty regarding the ranking list until **October 27, 2021** at 10.00 AM at the latest via the Office for General and Legal Affairs.

The Faculty will publish the final ranking list on **October 28, 2021** by 10.00 AM.

Enrolment of the candidates in the first year of Master Academic Studies will be done on **October 29** and **October 30, 2021** from 10.00 AM to 2.00 PM, office 104.
